Suzanne E. Kingery, M.D., is a pediatric endocrinologist with Norton Children's Endocrinology, affiliated with the UofL School of Medicine. She supports pediatric patients with diabetes and endocrine conditions, including thyroid disease, disorders of growth, precocious and delayed puberty, adrenal disorders and intersex conditions.

Dr. Kingery also serves as director of Norton Children's Endocrinology's Pediatric and Adolescent Gender Education (PAGE) program. In this role, she supports a multidisciplinary team, including a licensed clinical social worker, registered nurse, endocrinologist and other support staff who serve gender-diverse and transgender youth. The PAGE program began in 2015 under Dr. Kingery's direction and leadership. It is the first and only program of its kind in Kentucky, welcoming over 150 new patients a year.

Dr. Kingery is a leader in pediatric medicine for gender-diverse and transgender youth, sharing her extensive experience through numerous community and professional speaking engagements as well as partnerships on many committees, advisory councils, networks and more.
